

# ARCHITECTURAL WASTE RECYCLING REQUIREMENTS

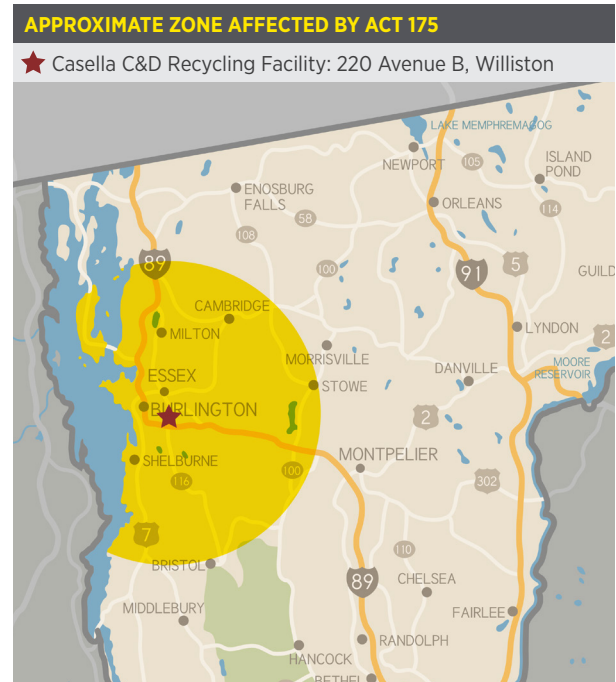
## VT ACT 175: Does this new law apply to your job site?

Act 175 is Vermont's architectural waste management law, enacted on January 1, 2015. It was intended to increase the recycling of materials from large scale construction projects and divert waste from disposal. The law requires large generators of architectural waste debris to separate specific materials for recycling. This sheet will help you identify if your project falls under these new guidelines. If so, we'll work together to provide you with the proper recycling solution!

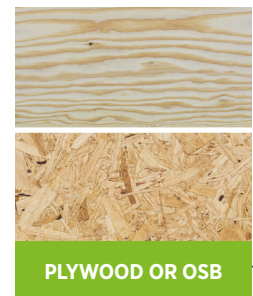
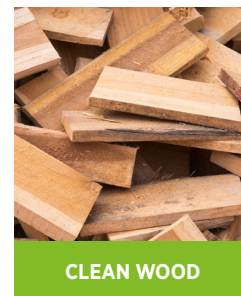
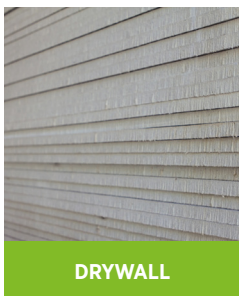
### CHECK LIST: Please check any that apply

- My project is within **20 miles** of a facility that will recycle the materials listed below.
- The project is a commercial building *OR* is a residential building with two or more units.
- The project will contain any of the following materials: **Drywall, Metal, Asphalt Shingles, Clean Wood, Plywood, or Oriented Strand Board (OSB).**
- The project will generate **40 Cubic Yards or more** of the materials listed above.

If you selected **ALL** of the above, then Act 175 requires that this material be diverted. Recycling these materials may also help you qualify for LEED credits.
